The Wrap Around crew would like to welcome all of our students back from what we hope was a fun and relaxing Spring Break. Spring is a time of new beginnings and that is certainly the case here at OJSH. We have quite a number of events and new items to inform our school community about. Before we get to that however, we did have some guest speakers come to the school at the end of March. On March 20, we had Lonnie Alexis from Alexis Nakoda First Nation speak to our Aboriginal Studies 20/30 class. Mr. Alexis has a vast amount of knowledge and experience that he was happy to share with our students. Our students and staff enjoyed the class and look forward to being able to listen to Mr. Alexis again. On March 21, we had a number of students sign up for a presentation from University of Alberta Indigenous Student Services. Students heard about all of the opportunities and services that are available to Indigenous students when they apply to the University of Alberta. We would like to encourage every student who is interested in attending the U of A to come to the Wrap Around and get the information that the presenter left with us.

There are a number of upcoming dates that we would like to make our school community aware of. April 11 is the deadline for students to register themselves for the June sitting of diploma exams. Since our Gr. 12 students are automatically registered when they are a student in our 30-level classes, this really only applies to the students who are taking a 30-level class through Vista or other similar online school. We just want to make sure that all of our students are registered and able to write their diploma exams in June.

















Spring is also a time where we begin planning and preparing for next year. In our High School Transition 9 classes, students will be doing pre-registration for high school by learning about credits, graduation requirements and the different streams of classes available in high school. Grade 9 students and their parents are encouraged to attend the Grade 9 Parent Evening on May 1, which coincides with the last Parent-Teacher Interview of the year. Parents will be able to get the same high school information that their children received in class and will also be able to ask questions and talk to their child's teachers if they need to.

Webs of Support Colour of the Month – Indigo Caring for the Carers

The colour indigo represents the web beneath the anchors. In the story of our "web", the child is the (green) balloon that sits on the web. The web is comprised of tangible (orange) and intangible (yellow) strings that are held by 5 or more adult anchors (red). The bigger the youth/balloon, the more likely it is to be held up on the web. The strings of the web can be eroded or cut away by scissor cuts (blue), which can cause the child to fall through. The anchors need a web too provided by other adults in their own lives that can step in and throw strings when need be. Anchors who have anchors is represented by indigo.

Caving for the carers means:

- · Giving back to and showing appreciation for those who anchor your web
- Supporting your anchors and keeping them in your web even when circumstances in
- Their own lives change
- Thanking your anchor(s) for the tangible and intangible strings they throw for you/your web
- Being an anchor for adults, not just children



Adults often feel they have to do everything on their own and, if they can't, they will be judged as being unsuccessful, "needy", or dramatic. Think of the last time a friend was in need. Did you judge them or did you empathize and step up to support them? Probably the latter! Thus, recognize times when you need support and that it is okay to accept help, and in turn, support others in need without judgement. Adults give a lot of themselves to the children they web-up. Adults can only give their best if they are at their best!
